


SSM FAQs



WHEN DO INTERVIEWS HAPPEN?

- Interviews will take place in early Spring 2019. We use behavioral based questions so reflect on past experiences and practice with your friends. Remember to dress professionally, be yourself and smile.
- Once all interviews have occurred and decisions have been made there are three offer letters that are sent to applicants. Hired, which will include your specific building and area. Alternate pool, or not hired. You need to accept your position and alternate status.

WHAT IS THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN AN RA & PL?

- PLs work with first-year students in traditional halls with around 25 or fewer residents and serve on larger staffs
- RAs work with returning students, typically within apartment spaces, they have anywhere from 30-75 residents and have smaller staffs.

WHEN DO APPLICATIONS GO LIVE?

- Applications go live October 1st, 2018 and are due December 3rd, 2018.
- Your applications require the following: Two letters of recommendations, 1 from a current student staff members and 1 nonstudent staff member recommendation. If you currently live off campus, two general recommendations are required.
- We will ask you to bring a resume to your interview. Be sure to tailor it to the Student Staff member role, highlight accomplishments and be specific
- The application is available online via StarRez on the myhousing link. Make sure to submit your application on time. Late applications will not be accepted.

WHAT TYPE OF COMPENSATION IS THERE?

- As a Student Staff Member (SSM) compensation varies depending on the position. You will be given a rent-free room on campus and a stipend throughout each semester.
- PLs receive a meal plan, RAs do not.
- Undergrads can earn extra compensation by working during holiday breaks.
- Graduate students only receive rent and are not eligible for break duty pay, but may need to work it.

WHAT ARE THE REQUIREMENT TO APPLY?

- You must be a current Georgia Tech Student. Undergraduate Applicants must have a 2.50 cumulative GPA and graduate student applicants must have a 3.0 cumulative GPA.
- Positions are for both semesters during the 19/20 academic year.
- You are required to attend Fall Training which takes place two weeks before classes start.
- All applicants must be in good standing academically, financially, and with conduct. You cannot be on housing probation as of August 20h, 2018.
