Roommate Agreement Type: Suitemate Agreement

Roommate Bill of Rights

- * The right to study free from undue interference in one's room (unreasonable noise or distractions that inhibit one's ability to study).
- * The right to sleep without undue disturbance from noise, guests of roommate(s), etc.
- * The right to expect that a roommate will respect one's personal belongings.
- * The right to a clean, hazard-free environment.
- * The right to free access to one's room and facilities without pressure from roommates.
- * The right to privacy, including the right to exclude non-residents of the apartment from the apartment.
- * The right to address grievances through appropriate, respectful communication.
- * The right to be free from fear of intimidation and physical or emotional harm.
- * The right to expect reasonable cooperation and use of shared space or appliances.
- * The right to seek help with the roommate relationship from Residence Life staff.

- Ignore the problem and move forward
- Address the concern with the other person in a respectful way
- Discuss the concern with the Resident Assistant before addressing the Roommate
