



### RESIDENT ASSISTANT COMMITMENT CALENDAR AY 2026-27

The commitment calendar is designed to help Resident Assistants plan for campus and department activities throughout the year. The Director of Residence Life may require staff to address other tasks during campus activities that affect the residence halls or during emergency situations. It is possible these dates and responsibilities may be revised depending on the department needs and the Georgia Tech academic calendar.

#### COMMITMENT DATES

<b>April 2026</b>	RAs must attend Spring Orientation. Dates will vary by RA staff.
<b>Monday, August 3, 2026 – Friday August 7, 2026</b>	RAs must complete pre-training modules virtually. RAs may <b>not</b> move into their fall assignments until August 7.
<b>Friday, August 7, 2026</b>	RAs may move into their Fall assignments between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. RAs must be completely moved into their assignments by 5 p.m. Staff training begins in team meetings shortly after.
<b>Friday, August 7, – Friday, August 14, 2026</b>	RAs must be present for the entirety Fall RA Training.
<b>Saturday, August 15 – Sunday, August 23, 2026</b>	RAs must be present and available for Campus Move-In and Week of Welcome.
<b>Thursday, December 17 – Monday, December 21, 2026</b>	RAs must be present and available for Semester Move-Out and Transition Day.
<b>Tuesday, December 22, 2026 – Wednesday, January 6, 2027</b>	RAs provide duty coverage during the break periods. RAs are expected to consult with their Hall Director prior to making travel arrangements.
<b>Wednesday, January 6, 2027</b>	RAs return from Winter Break must be back in area by 5:00 PM.
<b>Thursday, January 7 – Saturday, January 8, 2027</b>	RAs must be present for Spring RA Training.
<b>January 2027</b>	RAs must be available to support the RA interview process.
<b>Thursday, May 13 – Sunday, May 16, 2027</b>	RAs must be present and available for Semester Move-Out and Transition Day.
<b>Monday, May 17, 2027</b>	Employment term ends at 5 PM. RAs should remain to assist their staff with closing and the transition of their community.
